## **CAREER OPPORTUNITIES**

Registered nurses provide direct nursing care to patients, deliver health education programs and provide consultative services regarding issues relevant to the practice of nursing. They are employed in a variety of settings including hospitals, nursing homes, extended care facilities, rehabilitation centres, doctors' offices, clinics, community agencies, companies and private homes.

### **EARNING POTENTIAL**

The average salary for a registered nurse in Saskatchewan was \$90,334, according to the provincial government's 2013 Saskatchewan Wage Survey.





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### WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

Clinical lab work, simulation learning and clinical practice education will be incorporated into each year of the program.

In addition to clinical practice education in acute care hospitals, you will also gain nursing experience in community settings such as schools, outpatient clinics, long-term care facilities, community health and public health organizations.

Eight students per year will be accepted into the Saskatchewan Collaborative Bachelor of Science in Nursing program, which is the result of a partnership with Great Plains College, Saskatchewan Polytechnic, University of Regina and Cypress Health Region. Preference for acceptance will be given to applicants that reside within the Cypress Health Region.

## **ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS**

- Grade 12 with a minimum 70% average in each of: English Language Arts A30 and B30 (Fransaskois A30/B30 or Français Immersion 30 may be substituted for ELA A30 or B30); One of foundations of math 30, pre-calculus 30 or calculus 30; both biology 30 and chemistry 30
- Criminal Record Check and Vulnerable Sector Search

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## SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBLE

Apply before April 30, you may be eligible for a \$500 Entrance Scholarship. Apply before June 30, if you are in Grade 11 and have a 70% average, you may be eligible for a \$1,000 Early Entrance Award.
