// DONOR PROFILE WITH THE BIGGAR & DISTRICT CREDIT UNION

Colleen Ostoforoff, Great Plains College development officer, had a chance to talk with Diane Larouche-Ellard, Biggar and District Credit Union marketing assistant, about why the Biggar and District Credit Union (BDCU) gives to the Great Plains College (GPC) Entrance Scholarship program.

CO: Since 2008, the Biggar & District Credit Union has contributed to the GPC Scholarship program. Why did you first give to the college?

BDCU: We want to show that it is very important to give to the community, it is part of our mandate. Credit unions focus on giving back.

CO: Why do you continue to support GPC?

BDCU: We think about the futures of our local youth. We want to show them that the BDCU is engaged and we're there for them and their important financial decisions. When we talk to community stakeholders, the college is often an important part of the discussion. It seems that so many businesses are centralizing their services and moving away from smaller locations throughout Saskatchewan. It is important to have the young people understand we have products that can help them grow right through college into their professional career.

CO: What do you tell others about GPC?

BDCU: Personally, I have seen my own children go through our school system. There is a need for scholarships not only to help monetarily, but because it helps bring value to the students and offers encouragement. It is an advantage for living in a smaller community and we can see the impact our donation is having locally.

CO: How would you compare your giving to GPC with your charitable giving to other organizations?

BDCU: The BDCU receives a sizable number of requests each year and sees the College as having substantial value in the education system, as it engages employees, and is visible and sizable in the community. The Biggar & District Credit Union contributed over \$1 million in monetary donations, sponsorships and promotional gifts to local organizations over the past 15 years. I see how rewarding it is when students succeed. It is important to keep the funds within the community.

CO: Anything else you would like to add about your experiences with us?

BDCU: We are in a position to help draw from new GPC students; not only potential employees but some of these new graduates go on to become business owners, and we want them to remember the BDCU. It is a winwin situation as it helps us strengthen our community together.

MEW PROGRAMS DEVELOPED FOR 2015-16

Great Plains College is dedicated to its mission of building careers, partnerships and communities. This mission is exemplified, in part, by the delivery of new programs in response to community needs and student demand. As a result, Great Plains College has launched five new programs in 2015-16. Each has been well received by students on the various campuses.

On our Warman campus, two new programs have been introduced. Announced earlier this year, the Business Certificate program began on September 1. New to the college's overall list of programs, a pilot offering of The Certificate in Management Essentials, a part-time 16 week program that provides practical and theoretical training to aspiring managers

in the trades and industry, was launched on September 11. Both these programs were met with strong student interest and enrolment.

At the Rosetown Program Centre, the Primary Care Paramedic program will be offered on weekends beginning in November. The part-time, industry-recognized program is fully accredited by the Canadian Medical Association. Furthermore, the curriculum aligns with primary care paramedic roles and responsibilities outlined in the National Occupational Competency Profiles for the Paramedic Practitioner of Canada.

Building upon the outstanding welding program that has emerged in recent years, the Swift Current campus is pleased to introduce a Welding Upgrader program that will allow employed welders to challenge the journeyman certification.

Throughout recent years, the demand for utilizing the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) as a benchmark for evidence of English speaking, listening, reading and writing skills has increased significantly. In response to the demand, Great Plains College is offering IELTS prep courses and exams at its Swift Current Campus.

Finally, although the Skills and Safety Training program is not new, there has been a significant expansion of training dedicated to the development of productive and safe employees. This initiative has helped place Great Plains College at the forefront in providing on-site training in Saskatchewan.
