// WELDING INSTRUCTOR JARED MCKENZIE WINS CICAN AWARD FOR TEACHING EXCELLENCE

During the 2016 Annual Conference, Colleges and Institutes Canada (CICan) was thrilled to announce the recipients of the 2016 Awards of Excellence, recognizing the passionate staff, teachers, researchers, administrators and students who excel in all aspects of post-secondary education. The winner of the CICan Gold Award for Teaching Excellence, Jared McKenzie, an instructor in welding at Great Plains College (GPC) since 2008, has developed an innovative curriculum entitled "Carhartts and Caviar" within his pre-employment welding class.

This program encourages creativity by asking students to research, design and build unusual projects based on a theme. Their creations are then presented for auction, with all proceeds going back to the college community.

// GREAT PLAINS COLLEGE OFFERS NEW POWER ENGINEERING COURSE

Great Plains College is pleased to announce the addition of a Third Class Power Engineering course at its Kindersley Campus.

The new course, which is brokered from Southern Alberta Institute of Technology (SAIT), will complement the existing Fourth Class Power Engineering program in Kindersley.

"Many of our students that complete the Fourth Class Power Engineering program are looking to continue their education with the Third Class course," explained Fritz Eckstein, region manager at Great Plains College. "This new course will allow our Fourth Class students to continue into Third Class training, while also opening the doors for others to further their education and career in the field." Applications are now being accepted for the first cohort of the course, which is set to run April 10-July 21, 2017. Anyone with a Fourth Class Provincial Certificate is eligible to apply.

"We know there is a high demand for power engineering programs in the province, so we're excited to offer another option for those wanting to access Third Class training," said Eckstein.

According to Great Plains College 2013-14 Annual Follow-up Survey conducted by Fast Consulting, 83 per cent of contacted Kindersley Fourth Class Power Engineering graduates were employed within the year following their program.

In the four-month Third Class Power Engineering course, students will work through the 60 SAIT Third Class Power Engineering modules and participate in an optional practicum. Successful completion of the modules and exams will give students six months' credit toward the Technical Safety Authority of Saskatchewan's steam time requirement at the Third Class level. Students will also have the opportunity to write the Part A and Part B interprovincial exams.

"This season was our most successful yet," Montgomery said. "We had interest from players across Western Canada and even some in the United States." The league wrapped up in May with a final championship tournament that was held in Saskatoon.

Like a true entrepreneur, Montgomery is always looking for new ways to grow his business. With that continuous improvement attitude in mind, he made a decision to return to school to grow his knowledge of the business world.

"Great Plains College was a great option for me because it offered a flexible learning environment and quality program instructors, right at home in Swift Current," Montgomery said.
