30 CREDIT HOURS

Students who have been accepted into the University of Saskatchewan's College of Agriculture and Bioresources can take their first year of study in several programs at Great Plains College. You can complete the first year of study of the Bachelor of Science in Agriculture (B.S.A.) with concentrations in Agricultural Biology, Agricultural Economics, Agronomy, Animal Science, Applied Plant Ecology, Crop Science, Environmental Science, Food and Bioproduct Science, Horticulture Science and Soil Science.

You can also take a first year of university studies and apply for entry into the second year of the B.S.A. Entry into the College of Agriculture and Bioresources is competitive.

The University of Saskatchewan is home to a world-class teaching and research facility for agricultural science. In addition, students at Great Plains College will benefit from the proximity to the Swift Current Research Development Centre, a leading agriculture research facility.

## ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

Students must be enrolled at the University of Saskatchewan in order to take university classes at Great Plains College. Visit [usask.ca](http://usask.ca) for more information.

## APPLICATION PROCESS

You must apply to the University of Saskatchewan as well as Great Plains College. The application deadline for admission to the College of Agriculture and Bioresources for 2018-19 is February 15, 2018. Contact a Great Plains College student adviser to work with you to apply to the University of Saskatchewan and select the appropriate courses. The final decision to register for classes is your responsibility.



Thinking about university but not quite ready to get lost in the crowd? Most courses are offered face-to-face, unless otherwise noted, with fewer than 35 students per class.

## COURSE LIST

The first year of the Bachelor of Science in Agriculture degree requires the completion of 30 credit hours. Although the course requirements for each concentration varies, the Bachelor of Science in Agriculture—Agronomy offers a typical first year.

### FALL: September-December

## SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBLE

You will be eligible for scholarships from the University of Saskatchewan and from Great Plains College. Students must take a full-time course load that is student loan-eligible to qualify for scholarship consideration at Great Plains College.

Apply to Great Plains College as a full-time student before April 30 for September entry, or October 31 for January entry, you may be eligible for a \$500–\$5,000 Entrance Scholarship. You may be eligible for a \$1,000 Early Entrance Award if you are in Grade 11, have a 70% average and you apply before June 30.
