## LOOKING FOR A BETTER JOB? CONSIDER UPGRADING.

You can take high school-level courses in an adult-focused learning environment while building your employability skills. This means you will be prepared to get a great job.

As a student, you help to build your own learning and career plan. Each unique plan is driven by your goals. The staff and instructors use your plan to support you through all the challenges and opportunities of going to school as an adult.

### WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

In an adult-focused learning environment you will complete credits for a Grade 12 standing recognized by the Ministry of Education. Core subject areas include English, Canadian Studies, mathematics and science and 30-level electives to finish the Grade 12 program.

The Adult Basic Education program also provides educational opportunities for individuals who have completed high school and wish to upgrade specific classes.

#### UPGRADERS

Did you leave high school early? Do you need a few more credits or higher marks in some subjects? Did you attend school in a country with different requirements?

Upgrading might be right for you. To enter into many post-secondary programs you will need specific high school courses and grades, which we offer in our Grade 12 classrooms.

### FINANCIAL AID

These are secondary programs and are not eligible for student loans consideration or Great Plains College Entrance Scholarships, however \$1,000 Adult Basic Education Persistence Awards are available to recognize students who've demonstrated perseverance in order to continue with their formal education. 

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### MINIMUM COURSE OFFERINGS

Each location offers options from the following Grade 12 subjects:

- English A30
- English B30
- One 20 or 30-level math
- One 20 or 30-level science
- One 30-level Canadian studies
- Two electives

Any requests for additional courses beyond the minimal education offerings may be available on a case-by-case basis in consultation with a student adviser, program coordinator and instructor.

# START DATES

Students may begin Grade 12 courses within two weeks of the start of the semester. Some start date exceptions may be considered on a case-by-case basis.

- Semester 1 starts the beginning of September.
- Semester 2 starts the beginning of January.

You may apply or contact a student adviser at any time to discuss entry into the Grade 12 program.
