



### WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

Learn to function as a team member in home and special care. Through a combination of hands-on classroom learning and labs, you will receive clinical experience in home and long-term care settings. This program focuses on working with the elderly, but you will be prepared to work with clients of all ages.

#### ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Grade 12 or successful completion of 15 post-secondary credits from a recognized institution
- English language requirement
- Accepted applicants will be required to provide evidence of a current criminal record check and vulnerable sector check prior to entering the clinical component of the program
- Standard First Aid and CPR HeartSaver 'C' AED or equivalent are required prior to entry into clinical
- Accepted applicants are

required to provide current immunization records

Please note that if you do not meet the academic requirements, special admissions options may be available.

#### SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBLE

Apply as a full-time student before April 30, you may be eligible for a \$500–\$5,000 Entrance Scholarship. Apply before June 30—if you are in Grade 11 and have a 70% average, you may be eligible for a \$1,000 Early Entrance Award.
