

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

The Liberal Arts Certificate is a flexible program, where you will be introduced to a wide range of university subjects and courses that are general to all walks of life, rather than specific to a particular profession or trade.

The completion of this program can function as a standalone certificate or as the first step toward many university degrees.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Grade 12
- English language requirement Please note that if you do not meet these entrance requirements, special admissions options may be available.

SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBLE

Apply as a full-time student before April 30 and you may be eligible for a \$500-\$5,000 Entrance Scholarship. If you are in Grade 11 and have at least a 70% average, apply by June 30 and you are eligible for a \$1,000 Early Entrance Award.

APPLICATION PROCESS

There is a two-stage application process for a Liberal Arts Certificate:

1. Contact a Great Plains College student adviser and they will work with you to complete the University of Regina undergraduate application form. You must also apply to Great Plains College.

2. Apply to the University of Regina through the Liberal Arts Certificate application process. Visit www.greatplainscollege.ca/programs for detailed course descriptions.
