



WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

Discover the various aspects of children's growth and development, and how to develop therapeutic relationships with children, youth, their families and other informal helpers.

Taking place both inside the classroom and in the community, you will enhance your knowledge of youth-centered supports

and behavioural intervention strategies, as well as Indigenous awareness and addictions. Practicum placements may be in group homes, community agencies, community schools or residential treatment facilities.

Full-time and part-time studies are available, and as a graduate, you may also transfer credits toward a Social Work degree or a Youth Care Worker diploma program.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Grade 12
- A security clearance, personal interview and/or medical may be required for practical placements
- English language requirement

Please note that if you do not meet these entrance requirements, special admissions options may be available.

SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBLE

Apply as a full-time student before April 30 and you may be eligible for a \$500–\$5,000 Entrance Scholarship. Apply before June 30—if you are in Grade 11 and have a 70% average and you may be eligible for a \$1,000 Early Entrance Award.
