





SREDA INDIGENOUS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SCHOLARSHIP (SIEDS)

About the Scholarship

The SIEDS scholarship is provided by Saskatoon Regional Economic Development Authority (SREDA) and the Saskatchewan Innovation and Opportunity Scholarship fund, in partnership with Saskatchewan Indigenous Economic Development Network. It is designed to recognize leaders in the indigenous community by offering a scholarship to an indigenous student who is actively enrolled in the Master of Business Administration (MBA) in Community Economic Development, offered by Cape Breton University and hosted at the Great Plains College Warman Campus.

One scholarship of \$5,000 will be provided for individuals entering and/or currently enrolled in the MBA in Community Economic Development program.

Eligibility

To be eligible, applicants must be currently enrolled in or accepted to the MBA in Community Economic Development program, at Great Plains College Warman Campus and a person of Aboriginal ancestry.

Applicants must also demonstrate involvement serving indigenous communities and/or as a productive member of the business or economic development sector, as well as academic success and readiness for the MBA in Community Economic Development.

Application Form

The application form is available online at www.greatplainscollege.ca/mba. The application form may be submitted by email or mail. Confirmation of acceptance to the MBA (Community Economic Development) program and a photocopy of your status card or Métis membership card or formal letter of support from an appropriate First Nations community leader must be submitted for the application to be considered. Completed applications must be received by **December 15, 2020**.

- Proof of ancestry
- Acceptance letter from Cape Breton University, indicating enrolment in Master of Business Administration in Community Economic Development program
- Brief summary of your recent involvement with indigenous communities and/or membership in the business or economic development sector
