



WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

You will learn skills to work directly with clients in long-term care, home care, assisted living, some areas in acute care, and even special needs classrooms. Theory, hands-on lab and clinical experience (check with each specific location regarding clinical availability) is provided. This program focuses on caring for the elderly, but you will be prepared to assist clients of all ages.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Grade 12 or GED or successful completion of 15 post-secondary credits from a recognized institution.
 - English language requirement.
 - Accepted applicants will be required to provide evidence of a current criminal record check and vulnerable sector check prior to entering the clinical component of the program.
 - Standard First Aid and CPR HeartSaver 'C' AED or equivalent are required prior to entry into clinical.
 - Accepted applicants are required to provide current immunization records prior to entry into clinical.
- Please note that if you do not meet the academic requirements, special admissions options may be available.
