

## SREDA INDIGENOUS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SCHOLARSHIP (SIEDS)

### About the Scholarship

The SIEDS scholarship is provided by Saskatoon Regional Economic Development Authority (SREDA) and the Saskatchewan Innovation and Opportunity Scholarship fund, in partnership with Saskatchewan Indigenous Economic Development Network (SIEDN). It is designed to recognize leaders in the Indigenous community by offering a scholarship to an Indigenous student who is actively enrolled in the Master of Business Administration (MBA) in Community Economic Development program, offered by Cape Breton University and hosted at the Great Plains College Warman Campus.

One scholarship of \$5,000 will be provided annually to an Indigenous student entering and/or currently enroled in the MBA in Community Economic Development program.

### Eligibility

To be eligible, applicants must be currently enrolled in or accepted to the MBA in Community Economic Development program at Great Plains College Warman Campus and a person of Indigenous ancestry (i.e. First Nation, Métis, or Inuit).

Applicants must also demonstrate interest and involvement in serving Indigenous communities and/or as a productive member of the business or economic development sector, as well as academic success and readiness for the MBA in Community Economic Development program. Preference will be given to emerging leaders who show a strong desire to work in the field of economic development.

Past SIEDS winners are not eligible to apply.

### **Application Form**

The application form is available online at <u>www.greatplainscollege.ca/mba</u>. The application form may be submitted by email, in person, or mail. To be considered, applicants must submit confirmation of acceptance to the MBA in Community Economic Development program, along with a photocopy of their Indian status card, Métis membership card, or another form of approved Indigenous citizenship documentation from an approved issuing authority (ex. Government of Canada, Métis Nation – Saskatchewan, Métis Nation of Alberta, etc.). **Completed applications must be received by October 31, 2022**.

### **Application Process**

To apply for the scholarship, please submit the following by email, mail or in person by 11:59 PM on October 31, 2022:

- Completed Application Form, signed and dated
- Proof of Indigenous ancestry
- Acceptance letter from Cape Breton University, indicating enrolment in Master of Business Administration in Community Economic Development program
- Brief summary of your recent involvement with indigenous communities and/or membership in the business or economic development sector, and how you plan to use this education in your future.
- Minimum of one letter of reference that supports you and demonstrates your commitment to serving Indigenous communities or participating in economic development or business-related activities.
