



WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

You will learn skills to work directly with clients in long-term care, home care, assisted living, some areas in acute care, and even special needs classrooms. Theory, hands-on lab and clinical experience is provided. This program focuses on caring for the elderly, but you will be prepared to assist clients of all ages.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Grade 12 or GED or successful completion of 15 post-secondary credits from a recognized institution.
- English language requirement.
- Accepted applicants will be required to provide evidence of a current criminal record check and vulnerable sector check prior to entering the clinical component of the program.
- Standard First Aid and CPR HeartSaver 'C' AED or equivalent are required prior to entry into clinical.
- Accepted applicants are required to provide current immunization records prior to entry into clinical.

SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBLE

Apply as a full-time student before April 30 and you may be eligible for a \$500-\$5,000 Entrance Scholarship. Apply before June 30—if you are in Grade 11 and have a 70% average, you may be eligible for a \$1,000 Early Entrance Award.
