Melfort



Weyburn



Complete the online application form on the relevant institution's website. Email international@saskcolleges.ca for assistance.



Pay the non-refundable application fee via Flywire.



Submit all secondary and post-secondary transcripts. Scanned copies of the documents are acceptable for admission

purposes. However, an original copy will have to be presented upon your arrival. All transcripts must be translated to English.

For Parkland, Great Plains and Southeast documents can be uploaded with your application. For Cumberland and North West, documents must be emailed to **international@saskcolleges.ca**



Provide proof that you meet the English language proficiency requirements. IELTS results can be scanned and uploaded with your online application. If you have not yet completed the IELTS test, you may still submit your application as long as you can provide your scheduled IELTS test date. Original copies of your IELTS results must be submitted when you arrive.

Other language assessments such as PTE, TOEFL and Duolingo are also accepted.

Acceptance Process

You will receive a message within three business days that will confirm that we have received your application.

Once your application and application fee have been received, your application will be processed to determine your eligibility for the program. This process takes three to five business days.

International students who meet the requirements of the program will be provided an **offer letter**.

The offer letter will request payment of the tuition deposit, equal to 50 per cent of the tuition amount.* This deposit **secures** your seat in the program. Tuition deposits must be paid via Flywire within 30 calendar days of the letter date. If you wish to pay 100 per cent of the first year of tuition up front please email international@saskcolleges.ca to indicate this at the time of application.

A **letter of acceptance** will be provided once the tuition deposit has been received. This is the document needed to apply for a study permit.

*Study Direct Stream applicants must pay 100 per cent of first-year tuition.



Study Permit / Co-op Work Permit

- International students must apply for a study permit from the Canadian government in order to study at a post-secondary institution in Canada.
- Your official letter of acceptance must accompany your application for a study permit to verify that you plan on studying at a Designated Learning Institution in Canada. Cumberland College, Great Plains College, North West College, Parkland College and Southeast College are all Designated Learning Institutions.
- It is strongly recommended that you submit your study permit application at least six months prior to the start of classes to allow adequate time for processing.
- For more information on the study permit process please visit www.cic.gc.ca.
- In addition to the letter of acceptance, you will have to prove that you have

the financial resources to cover the full program tuition and fees as well as living expenses for the duration of your study period. You will also have to verify that you do not have a criminal record, that you do not pose a security risk to Canada and that you are in good health.

- As part of the program requirements, students must complete a practicum or clinical placement in the following:
 - Administrative Assistant
 - Agriculture Equipment Technician
 - Business Diploma
 - Continuing Care Assistant
 - Early Childhood Education Diploma
 - Heavy Equipment Truck and Transport Technician
 - Hotel and Restaurant Management
 - Youth Care Worker Diploma

In preparation for these programs, students should apply for a Co-op Work Permit at the time of their Study Permit application.




Saskatchewan Immigrant Nominee Program
