In an adult-focused learning environment you will complete credits for a Grade 12 standing recognized by the Ministry of Education. Core subject areas include English, Canadian Studies, mathematics and science and 30-level electives to finish the Grade 12 program.

The Adult Basic Education program also provides educational opportunities for individuals who have completed high school and wish to upgrade specific classes.

#### **UPGRADERS**

Did you leave high school early? Do you need a few more credits or higher marks in some subjects? Did you attend school in a <u>country with different requirements?</u>

Upgrading might be right for you. To enter into many postsecondary programs you will need specific high school courses and grades, which we offer in our Grade 12 classrooms.

#### **START DATES**

Students may begin Grade 12 courses within one week of the start of the semester. Some start date exceptions may be considered on a case-by-case basis.

- Semester 1 starts the beginning of September.
- Semester 2 starts the beginning of January.

You may apply or contact a student adviser at any time to discuss entry into the Grade 12 program.
