



WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

Demand for competent health and safety practitioners is increasing steadily and is forecast to accelerate in the future. This diploma program is designed for existing safety practitioners who support occupational health and safety within their organization.

Students will find themselves stretched by new critical thinking skills, as a result bringing richer perspective to their daily practice. Course material builds upon the skills developed in the CHSEP, COHSES, or recognized equivalent program through six core courses and two electives. This program will provide students with the knowledge required to develop, implement and evaluate occupational health and safety programs and systems in the workplace.

This program has continuous intake; however, each course within the program has specific start and end dates. Program duration will vary depending on the availability of individual classes. Full-time students can complete the program within a 52-week period, while part-time or casual students can complete the program as time and finances allow. The purchase of textbooks will be required for some of the courses within the program.

This diploma is recommended by the Canadian Society of Safety Engineering and recognized by the Board of Canadian Registered Safety Professionals.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must hold a valid CRSP designation or an approved college or university certificate in Occupational Health and Safety, which totals a minimum of 300 hours of health and safety education.

You must provide one of the following:

- An official letter or transcript confirming your completion of a health and safety certificate
- An official transcript confirming the completion of a minimum of 300 hours of health and safety courses
- Your CRSP designation number

It is essential that you have access to a computer, internet,

headset and microphone for weekly webinars.

PROGRAM FEES*

Entire Diploma: \$5,418 (plus textbooks)

Individual Courses: \$640 (plus textbooks)

Students can take the entire program or individual courses as time and finances allow.
